Director's Note

Welcome to a 1964 that may or may not have ever really existed. As a child of the 1970s, I grew up watching reruns of '60s sitcoms, and have romanticized the era ever since. Well before I even knew what adulthood was about, I knew I wanted to live like the people on *The Dick Van Dyke Show*. Mid-century modern with a sleek, streamlined look? Pretty wife in Capri pants? A convertible with fins? Sign me up!

Television also introduced me to the films of the era, not surprisingly including Barefoot In The Park. I was probably eight or nine years old when I first met Paul, Corie, and company, and I immediately fell in love with them all. Since then, I've easily seen half a dozen or so productions of Barefoot, but this is my first time being involved with it as anything more than a happy audience member. I couldn't have asked for a more talented and good-natured cast and crew, and I thank them all for making this visit to my favourite era so enjoyable. I've had a blast playing archivist and making sure all the music you hear and the objects you see existed in 1964. It's also cool to look at our set and recognize more than a few of my own home furnishings. For those who know me well, and are sharp-eyed, see if you can spot two very specific touches that I consider my "fingerprints" in the Bratter apartment...


